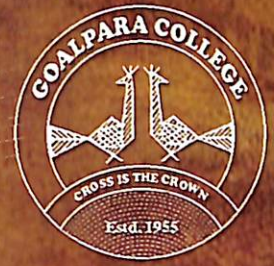

## 1. INTRODUCTION

### 1.1 A BRIEF HISTORY OF GOALPARA COLLEGE :

It was the 8<sup>th</sup> August, 1955 when Goalpara College came into existence as a night college under the Principalship of Late Wazuddin Ahmed, MSc, B.L. with 6 lecturers and 22 students. Before the date mentioned, the undivided Goalpara district had only one degree college at Dhubri, the then district headquarter situated on the north bank of the Brahmaputra. Owing to poverty, poor communication system and other socio-economic problems the aspirant youths of the very remote places of the south bank of the Brahmaputra were not able to get themselves admitted to the said college. Moreover it was simply impossible to cater to the needs of a large number of the aspiring youths of a district so large in size extending from Guwahati to the western border of the East Pakistan (now Bangladesh). With the unstinting support and guidance of Late Khagendra Nath Nath, the then M.L.A. of Goalpara and social activist, a group of sympathetic and enthusiastic people dedicated themselves for establishing a college on the south bank of the Brahmaputra and because of their relentless endeavour, and indomitable spirit ultimately, this undergraduate college was established in Goalpara town. With the co-operation and financial help of the generous people of the locality, soon there was a permanent structure of the college building to make it a full-fledged institution of higher education of the district of Goalpara on the south bank of the Brahmaputra in 1959. It was brought under the deficit grants-in-aid system in 1962. When college began to receive the deficit grants-in-aid from the government and got a little over the financial constraints, the same group of enthusiastic people undertook another bold venture of opening the science stream. As a result the science faculty was introduced in 1966 and was brought under the deficit Grants-in-aid system in 1974. Since then, both the faculties have been flourishing and attracting large number of students from various parts of the state and even from the neighbouring state and during the last academic session i.e. 2013-2014 the college enrolled about 2000 students into



its different courses. The College has been brought under the provisions of the Assam College Employees (Provincialisation) Act, 2005 w.e.f. December, 2005.

Besides the computerised library with more than 32,213 volumes of books, the college is enriched a good number of journals and magazines along with reprographic-- facilities both for students and faculty members. The college has a UN/UNESCO reading Library corner.

The College has received financial assistance from Dept of Bio technology, Govt of India for strengthening of Life Science and Bio-technology education and training at under graduate level under BIO-TECH HUB SCHEME.

The College has two study centres of K K Handiqui State Open University and IDOL, GU and has already started imparting regular & vocational education in the form of different courses through distance and open learning. Moreover the college library has registered itself for N-LIST at INFLIB NET at Ahmedabad for e-journals and e-books.

The college governing body has decided to introduce commerce stream in higher secondary class from the session 2014-15 thereby paving the way for introduction of the said stream at degree level.

### 1.2 VISION :

Our vision is to make the young people irrespective of gender, community and race educated with scientific spirit, social responsibility, free thinking, creative mind, human values and spiritual wisdom who could be instrumental in fulfilling the vision of the nation - a developed India in the 21st century.

### 1.3 MISSION :

Our mission is that we are sincerely committed to the cause of empowerment of the aspirant youths of the N-E region in general and lower Assam in particular through the access to higher education in formal, non-formal and vocational courses, to meet the changing needs and future challenges and to achieve excellence in every activity both at the individual and the social levels.

### 1.4 GOALS AND OBJECTIVES :

Based on the mission and vision stated above our goal is the pursuit of excellence in every field. We are looking for the best talents in games and sports, music, art, literature and cultural activities and above all in the academic field. This goal makes us spell out the following objectives :

- \* to promote among the students as well as teachers an awareness of socio economic needs of the state and prepare them for the fulfillment in co-curricular and extra curricular activities.

## 2. COURSES OF STUDY

The college offers three years under graduate courses both in Science and Arts faculty leading to Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.) and Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) degrees. Besides these degree courses, the college also has two years Higher Secondary courses in Science, Arts & Commerce. There is provision for the students to opt for Major courses in some subjects in the degree level.

### 2.1.2 COMBINATION SUBJECTS:

#### (A) FOR 1<sup>ST</sup> YEAR DEGREE CLASS.

##### ARTS FACULTY:

(i) **Compulsory Subjects (two)**: English, M.I.L. (Assamese) or Alt. English

(ii) **General Course**: A student seeking admission to Degree General Course shall have to choose any two elective subjects.

However he/she will not be allowed any of the following combinations:

- (ii) Political Science / Mathematics
- (iii) Political Science / Statistics
- (iv) Education / Mathematics
- (v) Philosophy / Statistics
- (vi) Philosophy / Mathematics

The above restrictions shall also apply to a student offering major in a particular subject.

(A) (iii) **Major Course**: A student may offer major in any one of the following subjects:

In addition to Major subject, he/she will have to choose an elective subject as per the restrictions already mentioned.

\* Students majoring in Literature subjects shall have to choose a different language other than their major subject i.e. English or Assamese in the compulsory paper namely MIL. For instance a student with English major cannot have Alt English and a student with Assamese major cannot have Assamese (MIL). In that case they may have a different language or a third elective subject.



**SCIENCE FACULTY :**

- (i) **Compulsory Subjects :** General and Functional English
- (ii) **GENERAL COURSE :** A general course student shall have to offer any one of the following combination of subjects :
  - (i) Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics

  - (v) Botany, Geography, Zoology

- (iii) **MAJOR COURSE :** A student may offer major in any one of the following combination of subjects :
  - (i) Chemistry (Major) - *Physics and Mathematics*
  - (ii) Physics (Major) - *Mathematics and Chemistry/Statistics*
  - (iii) Botany (Major) - *Chemistry and Zoology*
  - (iv) Zoology (Major) - *Botany and Chemistry*
  - (v) Mathematics (Major) - *Physics & Chemistry, Statistics & Economics, Zoology & Botany, Geography & Economics, Physics & Statistics*
  - (vi) Geography (Major) - any two of the following subjects:  
*Botany, Zoology, Mathematics, Statistics.*

**ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR OFFERING A SUBJECT**

A student opting for any subject shown in Column I below must have passed the corresponding subject/subjects shown in Column II in the +2 or equivalent examination.

- (B) Environmental studies with field study is compulsory for both Arts & Science students in III and IV semester.

**ARTS FACULTY :** Students of both General and Major courses will have to offer the same combination of subjects as in the I & II Semester examination.

**SCIENCE FACULTY :** Students of both General and Major courses will have to continue the same combination of subjects as in I & II semester except General and Functional English.

**(C) FOR III<sup>rd</sup> YEAR DEGREE CLASS :**

**ARTS FACULTY :** Students of General course will have to continue the same combination of subjects as that in Part II excluding the compulsory subjects, i.e. General English and M.I.L. / Alternative English. Students of Major course will have to continue only the Major subject.

**SCIENCE FACULTY :** Students of General course will have to choose any two subjects out of the three subjects offered in Part II. Students of Major course will have to continue only the Major subject.

**2.2 HIGHER SECONDARY COURSE :**

This is a vital part of academic activities in the colleges of Assam, though it is not included in the academic activities defined by the U.G.C.

**2.2.1 Course of Study :**

The Higher Secondary (H.S.) course under Assam Higher Secondary Education Council is of two years duration. At the end of the first year, there will be an examination conducted by the College. After successful completion of the said examination, a student is allowed to appear in the H.S. Final examination at the end of the Second Year.

**2.2.2 Combination of Subjects :**

In +2 stage for both Arts and Science faculties, English and M.I.L. (Assamese)/ Alt. English are compulsory subjects. In addition, a student of Arts faculty has to study



three more subjects taking not more than one subject from the following groups. If desired, a fourth subject may be offered as an additional subject.

(i) **ARTS FACULTY:**

- Group 1 : Economics / Advance Assamese
- Group 2 : Political Science / Mathematics
- Group 3 : Political Science / Statistics
- Group 4 : History / Mathematics
- Group 5 : History / Statistics
- Group 6 : Education / Statistics
- Group 7 : Education / Mathematics
- Group 8 : Adv. Assamese / Logic & Philosophy / Mathematics / Geography
- Group 9 : Arabic / Adv. Assamese / Geography
- Group 10 : Arabic / Adv. Assamese / Statistics / Geography
- Group 11 : Introductory Computer Science
- Group 12 : Mathematics / Logic & Philosophy / Adv. Assamese / Arabic

*Except Assamese (MIL) no other MIL will be allowed*

Note 1 : Introductory Computer Science is allowed with Mathematics only.

Note 2 : Statistics is allowed only with Mathematics.

(ii) **SCIENCE FACULTY:** A student of Science faculty may offer either three or four subjects from the following combinations:

1. Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics and Biology / Statistics / Introductory Computer Science
2. Physics, Statistics, Mathematics and Introductory Computer Science / Geography
3. Physics, Geography, Mathematics and Biology / Statistics / Introductory Computer Science
4. Economics, Statistics, Mathematics and Geography / Introductory Computer Science



(iii) **COMMERCE FACULTY:**

- A. Compulsory subject: English, MIL (Assamese/Alt English), Environmental Education.
- B. Elective subjects (Compulsory): Business studies, Accountancy
- C. Elective subjects (Optional): Any Two subjects from the groups (One subject from each group)
  - a. Economics / Salesmanship and Advertising / Insurance / Banking / Economic Geography / Computer Science and Application
  - b. Commercial Arithmetic & Elements of Statistics / Mathematics / Statistics

Environmental Education has been included as a qualifying subject in the 1st year and students will have to appear in a paper for 50 marks.

2.3 **Medium of Instruction:**

The medium of instruction in the +2 level is Assamese. However, the inconveniences of English medium students are always kept in mind during teaching.

In degree (General), the medium of instruction is Assamese and in Degree (Major), the medium of instruction is English.



## 3.1 UNIVERSITY AND COUNCIL EXAMINATIONS :

### 3.1.1 Higher Secondary Course :

There will be two examinations. Higher Secondary First Year Examination will be held at the end of the first year and it will be conducted by the college at the end of 1st year and Higher Secondary Final Examination will be held as per Council notification.

### 3.1.3 T.D.C. COURSE :

Regulation of TDC for Semester System & with Choice based Credit and Grading System.

1. TDC shall be of Six Semester covering three Calendar Year. The Schedule for Semester system shall be as shown below :

- (a) *First, Third and Fifth Semester* : *August 1 - Dec 31*  
(including examination)
- (b) *Second, Fourth and Sixth Semester* : *January 1 - July 31*  
(including examination)
- (c) *Semester Break* : *July 1 - July 31*

The Academic Calender and schedule for Semester System is given in Annexure -I. Course Structure under Semester System given in Annexure - II.

2. Student's performance should be monitored throughout the Semester by continuous assessment in the theory and practical courses. Evaluation of the Students performance in each of the theory and practical paper will be based on the following :

*Internal Evaluation* : 20 % Marks  
*External Evaluation* : 80 % Marks

- 3. Internal Evaluation should be based on two sessional examinations, home assignments, Seminars, and library work in each Semester. The schedule for internal evaluation is given in Annexure - I. The procedure for internal evaluation is given in Annexure- III.
- 4. External Evaluation should be through a final examination at the end on the Semester. The procedure for external evaluation is given in Annexure - IV.
- 5. The Pass marks in each theory paper is 30 % and that in each practical paper is 40%.
- 6. In each paper, students must secure pass marks in both the internal as well as the external evaluation separately.
- 7. A student who could not appear or failed in any Semester examination will be allowed to clear the same as follows



- (a) First Semester with the regular Third Semester examination.
  - (b) Second Semester with the regular Fourth Semester examination.
  - (c) Third Semester with regular Fifth Semester examination.
  - (d) Fourth Semester with regular Sixth Semester examination.
- 8. A student may be allowed to "repeat" any one of the theory papers in the First, Second, Third and Fourth Semester and may be allowed for "betterment" of marks in one paper in the Fifth Semester, provided the student secures less than 45% marks in that paper.
  - 9. No "repeat" / "betterment" shall be allowed in the practical examination in any Semester.
  - 10. A student must pass all this Semester examination, including "repeat" and "betterment" chances within five years from the date of admission to the First Semester course. A student will get a maximum of three chances to clear a particular Semester.
  - 11. In case of any dispute regarding evaluation or unforeseen events the matter may be placed in the Committee of courses and Studies (U.G.) for amicable settlement.
  - 12. Since the Semester involves continuous assessment there would be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any subject.
  - 13. For any matter not covered under this Regulation for Semester System. The existing University Rules and the Gauhati University Act 1949 (as amended till date) should be applicable.

Note: The exact date of the sessional examinations shall be fixed by the College authority and that of the final semester examination by the C.E.G.U. The Controller of Examinations would announce the results of the final examinations. Admissions will be given by following University Rules.

## Annexure - II

### *Syllabus and Course Structure under Semester System*

1. The syllabus for each paper should be divided into modules or units. Each unit should be assigned marks (Preferably equal marks for each unit) so that the question paper of the final semester examination cover the entire syllabus.
2. The minimum total marks in a graduate course should be (preferably) in between 2400-3000. Due to different nature of subjects, with practical or otherwise, the individual stream may make the final decision regarding the total marks.
3. In the Sixth semester there must be at least one paper where the students are given the opportunity to apply their knowledge. The course may be so designed that students creativity is encouraged. This could be a small academic project, an advanced level practical work including literature survey on a topic, field / survey work or any other work which may induce creativity among the students.

The students must submit two copies of the Project work prepared in the format of a Ph.D. or M.Phil thesis. The student will have to defend the work before an external examination and Internal Board comprising of three teachers including the supervisor / guide. The external examiner will evaluate out of 80% and the Internal Board will evaluate out of 20%.



## Annexure - III

### Procedure for Internal Evaluation

1. The marks allotted for internal evaluation (20%) in each paper will be based on the following :
  - (a) Sessional Examination I
  - (b) Sessional Examination II
  - (c) Home Assignment, Seminars and Group Discussion, or related work depending on the decision of the teacher / college concerned. Home assignment etc. (as in (c) above) may be given to the students at any time during the semester. These may be regarded as one question (out of four) in each of the sessional examination and marked accordingly. Thus (c) above is a part of the sessional examinations and the total internal marks in a - c above would be 20% of the marks allotted to the paper.
2. Each sessional examination will be of one hour duration and be conducted by the College authority of each paper. The setting of question paper, invigilation duty, evaluation of answer scripts for each paper will be done by the concerned teacher (s) as a part of his / her normal duty.
3. The authority concerned will fix the exact date of the sessional examination in each paper following the guidelines of academic schedule (Annexure - I). Each sessional examination will be of one hour duration and the students should write the examination in proper University answer books.
4. After evaluation the answer scripts should be shown to the students and corrections should be made if there are any. After this, the answer scripts should be collected back from the students. The entire process of evaluation of a sessional examination should not take more than two weeks from the date of examination.
5. There is no provision for re-appearing or "repeat" / "betterment" in the sessional examination. If a student miss one or both examination for valid reasons (as evidenced by medical certificate or other authentic documents) then the teacher / college concerned may allow the student a separate examinations using the teachers own discretion.
6. If a paper is taught by more than one teacher then the concerned teacher should co-operated in conducting the internal evaluation. Each sessional examination for a particular paper should be one examination of one hour duration even if several



teachers may be teaching the paper. However, since the contents of a paper in a semester examination is approximately half that of a full paper in annual examination, it is strongly recommended that one paper in a semester system be taught by only one teacher.

7. At the end of the semester and before the final semester examination begin, the concerned teacher(s) should submit the internal marks in proper markseets along with the answer scripts to the C.E., G.U.
8. The affiliated colleges should submit the internal evaluation marks and the answer scripts directly to the Controller of Examinations, G.U.
9. Scrutiny of the answer scripts and scaling of the internal marks may be arranged by the Controller of Examinations if necessary.

## CREDIT & GRADING

### 1. Definition of Credit :

- (a) The theory paper would have one credit for each hour of instruction per week in a semester. The activities include lectures, tutorials and others for internal evaluation (Seminar, group discussion, laboratory / demonstration session mini project etc.)

A theory paper (which is equivalent to 100 marks of course load) should be of 6 (six) credit points which would consist of 4 hrs, of lectures and 2 hrs of tutorial & other activities. A theory paper of 50 marks would have 3 (three) credit points : 2 hrs of lectures - 1 hrs tutorial (& others).

For science subjects with practical one hour tutorial may be outside the office hours for home work, literature survey / internet browsing etc.

- (b) Practical papers / courses would have one credit point for every 2 hrs of laboratory work per week in a semester. If the number of hrs per week is an odd number, appropriate adjustment be made it to the nearest even number for example.

- 1) 3 hrs lab per day x 2 days per week = 6 hrs = 3 credits
- 2) 3 hrs lab per day x 3 days per week = 9 hrs = 4 credits
- 3) 3 hrs lab per day x 6 days per week = 18 hrs = 9 credits



If the total number of practical courses is 18hrs per week, then 3 hrs per week be devoted as home work for preparing the report (i.e. lab book) and other activity related to practical.

- (c) P.G. Dissertation by research work / projects would be of 12 credit points by 24 hrs of work per week in a semester. The dissertation would involve seminar, presentation, demonstrations, viva-voce examinations, and (if required) visit to other institutions or research lab for data collection etc. About six to nine hrs of work may be allowed to such activities outside class hours and about 18 to 15 hrs of work for the laboratory work.
- (d) Other type of work such as departmental seminar, field / industrial training would be compulsory for the student, but no credit or marks for internal evaluation be assigned for such activities. Moreover, class attendance should not be considered for internal (or external) evaluation. Attendance including of department seminars would be treated under the University rules of minimum 75% attendance required for appearing in the examinations.

### 2. Total Credit per semester :

Every student must complete a minimum of 30 credits per week in a semester this amounts to about 30hrs of contacts teaching per week. The total number of credit for a four semester course should be between 120-140. For a two semester or a eight semester course the total credit points may be worked out accordingly.

### 3. Core Course and Elective Courses :

- (a) Core courses are compulsory set of papers which also include those offered for specialization in each branch of the subject. For example, the set of papers (theory & practical) offered under specialization in physical chemistry would be considered under core course for the concerned student of physical chemistry. The total credit assigned for the core courses would be not more than 80% of the total credit (viz, 96 credits out of 120 total credits).
- (b) **Elective Courses :** The essence of the credit system is the freedom of choice given to the students for opting for courses / papers within and outside the department. Moreover, student's mobility from one institution to another be encouraged by a credit transfer mechanism. However, the total credit points thus earned by opting for elective courses should be a





- minimum of 20% of total credit (viz. 24 credits out of total of 120 credits).
- (i) Students' counseling by the teachers is a must to guide the students to opt for elective courses those are relevant to the concerned subject in which the student is registered for a degree.
  - (ii) The students may be allowed to complete the elective course at their own place. For example, a student who wishes to opt for a course or do his / her Dissertation / Research work in another institution, may be allowed to do so after completing other requirements in the parent institution.
  - (iii) Good students may be allowed to take extra load (over specified minimum 24 credits) in electives. The grade sheet / Transcripts would the extra papers as Audit Course, but the grades obtained by the students would not be used for the calculation of GPA and CPI.

#### 4. GRADING SYSTEM:

##### (a) Conversion of marks to Grades :

Actual marks secured by a group of candidates are converted into Relative Percentile (R) before conversion into Relative Letter Grades. The maximum Actual marks (i.e. Highest mark) (M) secured in a particular Group is converted into 100% and other actual marks (A) secured by the students of the same groups are converted to the Relative Percentile.

$$R = (100 / M) \times A \text{ where}$$

R = Relative Percentile  
M = Maximum (Highest) marks in the class  
A = Actual marks of a student who passed i.e. if the actual marks is not less than 30%

- (b) Conversion Table for Relative Percentile into Letter Grades and Grade points
- (c) Conversion of Grades to CGPA & CPI : Grade point average (GPA) is used as a numerical survey of academic achievement, First, Grades are assigned to points in a 10 points scale as follows :

A = 10 points, B = 8 points, C = 6 points, D = 4 points, E = 2 points, F = 0 points. Secondly, the hours of credit for each course are multiplied by the Grade point value to determine the honour points. The honour



points are then added for all the courses / papers in a Semester. The same of honour points in a given semester is then divided by the total number of credits.

**Example :** Grade point average (GPA) =  $480 / 60 = 8.0$

- (3) A student who has completed a semester may be allowed to proceed to the next semester irrespective of number of papers where the student failed.
- (4) In order to complete a course a student must obtain pass marks in all the papers in the semesters offered to the student in the degree course (PG or UG).
- (5) A student who fails in elective papers may be allowed to replace them by other elective papers of the same credit after obtaining prior approval from the department. For this the procedure for repeating (as in (2) above) would be applicable.
- (6) Students who secure the lowest grade (viz. E grade) may be given the option to repeat that paper by following the procedure for repeating (as in (2) above)
- (7) *Internal Evaluation : the following guidelines be followed :*
  - (i) For every paper there should be a separate internal evaluation conducted by the teachers involved in teaching that paper.
  - (ii) Each teacher involved in teaching a paper would conduct a one-hour written examination of (16-20 % marks) some time in the middle of the semester. If seminars or group discussions are held as a part of internal evaluation, then each student should submit a report, which may be assigned about 4% marks (within 20%) in internal evaluation.
  - (iii) The mid semester examination answer scripts (with marking) should be shown to the student so that they are aware of the progress made by them in the course.
  - (iv) Attendance in class should not be considered for internal evaluation.





#### 4. ADMISSION

##### 4.1 Admission to different courses :

Application for admission to the college should be submitted in the prescribed form obtainable from the college office on payment of nominal charge.

The prospectus and the application form for admission into the H.S. and Degree courses are issued immediately after the announcement of the result of H.S.L.C./H.S. Examination. Last date of submission of completed forms and date of interview for admission are notified in advance.

An application for admission must be accompanied by attested copies of the following documents. All these documents must be produced in original at the time of interview for admission.

- (i) *Marksheets of Examinations passed.*
- (ii) *Admit Card of H.S.L.C. Examination.*
- (iii) *Pass Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended.*
- (iv) *Caste Certificate from competent authority.*
- (v) *Gap period certificate from competent authority.*
- (vi) *One passport size photograph of the candidate duly attested by the Head of the Institution (to be pasted on the form).*

##### 4.2 ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION :

*Minimum qualification for admission into first year H.S. class is a pass in H.S.L.C. Examination while that for first year T.D.C. class is a pass in H.S.S.L.C. Examination. However, admission into the college is strictly on merit basis subject to the availability of seats. For issuing Admission form for H.S.S.L.C classes the percentage of marks of H.S.L.C. must be more than 45% for Local and 50 % for others or non local . Further there will be 5% less for SC/ST/OBC/MOBC or Physically Challenged /Extra-curricular certificate holders. The admission into the college takes place on the day of the interview and candidates have to pay necessary fees at the time of admission. The selected candidates must get themselves admitted on the very day of interview failing which they shall forfeit their claim for admission.*

##### 4.3 Admission to Hostels :

A candidate seeking hostel accommodation must apply in a separate prescribed application form to be submitted after taking admission.



#### 5. FACILITIES AVAILABLE IN THE COLLEGE :

##### 5.1 LIBRARY FACILITY :

The college provides computer aided library and reading room facilities to the students as well as teachers. The college library has at present about 32,000 books and a good number of journals. A student can avail the library, reading room & reference room facilities any time during the working hours of the college.

Reprographic facility is also available in the library. The college has book bank facility for the needy and deserving students.

The functioning and use of the library by the teachers and students are governed by a set of library rules. Library has 12 nos magazine, 8 nos daily News Paper and 14 nos Journal. Moreover Library has INFLIBNET facility for e-journals and e-books.

##### 5.2 STUDENTS' AID FUND :

Financial assistance is granted to the poor students out of the students' aid fund. Such grants are given to the poor and meritorious students on the basis of their application to the principal and subjects to the availability of fund.

##### 5.3 SCHOLARSHIPS / AWARDS :

**Moziruddin Ahmed Memorial Scholarship** will be institute from this year by the donation given by Kamrul Hasan and Dr Moshrafuddin Ahmed. A sum of Rs. 3 Lakhs has been donated for this purpose. In every year four scholarship will be given to four maritorious students which will be as follows.

- (i) Student securing highest aggregate marks in Higher Secondary Final Examination in both Arts and Science.
- (ii) Student securing highest aggregate marks in TDC Final Examination in both Arts and Science.

Moreover deserving students can enjoy the benefits of various Central and State Government Scholarhips such as National Merit Scholarship, State Merit Scholarship, Scholarships to Char area students and ITDP sponsored SC/ST/OBC/MOBC Scholarships.

Apart from the above scholarships, the college offers the following aids and supports

- (i) Waiving of full tuition fee for one year for those students who secure first position in the 1st year H.S. and TDC I (total score of Ist & IInd semester), TDC II (total score of 3rd and 4th semester) for major students in both faculties in every year.





- 5.4 BEPIN CH, GHOSE (TEACHER) MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP :**
- One scholarship will be awarded to the students securing higher aggregate marks in the 1st year TDC examination (2nd semester result) in both Arts and Science
  - One scholarship will be awarded to the students securing higher aggregate of marks in 2nd year TDC examination (4th semester result) in both Arts and Science.
- The amount of scholarship will be Rs. 500/- (five hundred) for each scholarship holders.

**5.9 STUDENTS' UNION AND ITS ACTIVITIES :**

The Goalpara College Students' Union is the general body of the students of this college. Its membership is compulsory for every student admitted to the college. The office bearers of the union are elected annually through direct ballot as per constitution of the union. As per directive of the DHE, Assam, from this session a student is eligible to contest the GCSU election only if he/she has a minimum 75% attendance in classes.

For the allround development of the students the students' union organises





various co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. Interested students may participate in different competitions in games and sports, debates and symposia, cultural items and social services organised inside the college. The college also participates in different competitions organised by the Gauhati University. Moreover, the college participates in different football, volley ball, debate and drama competitions conducted by different organisations.

The students' union also publishes a College Magazine every year and a wall magazine twice a year as media for developing the potentialities of the students.

## 6. RULES AND REGULATIONS

### 6.1 Identity card and college uniform :

A nontransferable identity card is issued to each student at the time of admission for a period of one year. The identity card containing relevant information of the holder together with a recent passport size photograph must be duly endorsed by the Principal.

*All students of the college shall have to wear College Uniforms prescribed by the college authority.*

### 6.2 Attendance of students :

Percentage of attendance will be counted from the date of beginning of regular classes. However, Percentage of attendance for election purpose will be counted from the date of commencement of all classes for the New Session.

A student must attend at least 75% of the lectures delivered in each subject to become eligible for appearing in the University or Council Examinations.

The scholarship holders must attend at least 80% of the lectures delivered in each subject for the renewal of their scholarships.

- 6.3. (i) Major students will have to be closely associated with the respective academic organisations available in the college.
- 6.3. (ii) Change in combination/major/faculty can be made with proper permission from the Principal within 30 (thirty) days of admission to the concerned class.

### 6.4 COLLEGE TRANSFER CERTIFICATE :

If a student wants to leave the college, an application to the Principal for issue of transfer certificate is to be submitted with clearance from the following :

- (i) College office.
- (ii) College library.
- (iii) Head of the department concerned in case of science students.
- (iv) N.C.C. officer in case of N.C.C. cadets.



- (v) Superintendents of the hostel concerned in case of hostel boarders.

### 6.5 HOSTEL RULES :

The boarders of the hostels must abide by the rules and regulations set up for the management of the hostels. Violation of these rules and regulations shall be treated as a cause for stringent punitive action which may include expulsion from the hostels as well as from the college.

Boarders are allowed to meet their visitors only on designated days and at a designated time.

### 6.6 MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE:

Every student will have to behave properly and maintain discipline inside and outside the college to uphold the prestige of the institution. No student is allowed to take the law into his/her own hand. The properties of the college must be preserved and protected by every student. The students of Goalpara college irrespective of caste, religion and language are expected to behave in such a way as if they are the members of a single family. **Ragging in any form is a punishable offence.** Moreover, students are to note the following seriously -

- (i) Use of tobacco & tobacco products including any form of Gutkha is strictly prohibited within the college campus and anybody found violating the above shall be severely punished.
- (ii) Use of Cell phones, within the college campus, class rooms and examination halls are strictly prohibited, the violation of which shall attract severe disciplinary action.
- (iii) Any grievance or dispute will be settled by Grievance Redressal Cell of the college through proper procedure. The procedure after Lodging complaints/grievances to Principal.

The library is managed by a set of library rules constituted for the purpose.

## (KKHSOU)

The college has a study centre of KKHSOU, which was established by the Govt of Assam in 2006 and recognized by the Distance Education Council (DEC), New Delhi. The main purpose, of the university is to promote education among the unreached, downtrodden and backward sections of the society through Open and Distance Learning (ODL) at very minimum and affordable fees. Presently, the study centre is offering the following courses-

Students who have passed 10+2 stage or Bachelor preparatory programme (BPP) of KKHSOU are eligible for admission in the above courses. Admission for BPP are held twice in a year and students who have not even passed HSLC can be admitted to BPP. Classes of KKHSOU are held every Sunday. KKHSOU will shortly launch its various professional Diploma and Certificate courses. Students of conventional B.A, B.Sc courses can also simultaneously take up their preferred courses of KKHSOU. This convergence of conventional and ODL (Open and Distance Learning) systems will greatly increase the scope of employability of the students. If a student is successfully through his B.A./B.Com./BCA/BBA/B.Sc course with one or two additional degree, diploma or certificate from KKHSOU, his qualifications and bargaining power in the job market will be enhanced. From this year KKHSOU is going to introduce Primary Teachers' Training Programme (Diploma in Elementary Education)

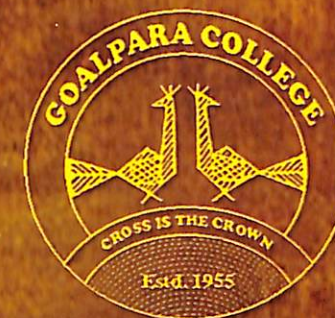
