

Cinema arrived in India on 7 July, 1896, when the short films of the Lumiere brothers were shown in downtown Mumbai. In 1913, D.G. Phalke, a successful printer, was inspired by seeing The Life of Christ on a trip to London. On returning to India, he made the nation's first feature film, Raja Harishchandra based on one of the stories of the religious epic The Mahabharata. The film was a huge success and Indian film industry has never looked back. The flow of the Indian upper classes back and forth between England and India also contributed to a boom in the medium. While silent films were successful in reaching beyond the nation's many differences, the talkies split the film industry along language lines. With the blockbuster *Alam Ara* in 1931, sound was added to Indian cinema establishing song and dance as part of the storytelling.
